Re: Request to Renew Waiver Granted to SaveView, Inc.

Dear Ms. Dortch:

I am writing on behalf of L-3 Communications SafeView, Inc. ("L-3 SafeView"). The company was formerly known as SafeView, Inc., prior to an acquisition.

On August 3, 2006, the Office of Engineering and Technology granted a waiver to SafeView, Inc.¹ By its terms, that waiver is renewable after two years.²

L-3 SafeView requests renewal for an additional two years, or for such longer time as the Commission may deem appropriate.

In support of this request, we note that we are not aware of any harmful interference caused to any spectrum user by L-3 SafeView's operations.

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
The original waiver grant limited the number of systems installed to 100 during the first year, and 200 during the second year.³ L-3 SafeView requests authority to continue installing at a maximum rate of 200 units per year, with the understanding that L-3 SafeView may request an increase in these numbers in the future.

Section 1.62 of the Commission's Rules generally allows a party to continue operation under an authorization while a timely-filed request for renewal of that authorization is pending.⁴ L-3 SafeView will assume this provision applies to the waiver unless the Commission notifies us otherwise.

Finally, we inform the Commission that the product in question, formerly called "SafeScout," has been renamed "ProVision 100." The product remains identical in all pertinent respects to that for which the Commission issued the waiver.
