Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Hamilton Relay, Inc. ("Hamilton"), this letter responds to the June 9, 2009 data request from the Interstate TRS Administrator.¹ The data request asks each VRS and Internet Relay provider to provide the percentage of calls currently placed using a ten-digit number issued pursuant to the 2008 numbering orders (as opposed to being placed by persons without such a number or using a proxy number), to the extent that this information is available.

Hamilton is an Internet Relay provider and its response to the data request is attached hereto. The data, covering the period from May 10, 2009 to June 9, 2009, show that as few as 2% of callers on June 6 were registered for a 10-digit number with Hamilton. The maximum percentage during this period occurred on May 24, when 32% of callers were registered for a 10-digit number with Hamilton. The average for the period covered was 14%.

Hamilton is unable to determine what percentage of callers may have a registered number through another iTRS provider, because currently there is no reverse lookup capability in the numbering database.
