





You recite that “[a]s a result of Hurricane Gustav . . . , the licensee incurred substantial damage to its tower[.]”¹ You state that “the area served by the station was also severely hard hit by the hurricane, which also impacts the licensee’s revenues and its ability to pay its regulatory fees.”² In support, you submit a letter from Pinnacle Towers LLC advising HBI that the station’s tower “was severely damaged as the result of Hurricane Gustav [and] must be demolished.”³ You also submit information regarding Hurricane Gustav from Wikipedia, an on-line encyclopedia, and photographs of damage to what appears to be a radio station tower.⁴

The Commission may waive, reduce, or defer regulatory fees only upon a showing of good cause and a finding that the public interest will be served thereby.⁵ The Commission will waive, reduce or defer its regulatory fees in those instances where a petitioner presents a compelling case of financial hardship.⁶ Regulatees can establish financial hardship by submitting:

information such as a balance sheet and profit and loss statement (audited, if available), a cash flow projection . . . (with an explanation of how calculated), a list of their officers and their individual compensation, together with a list of their highest paid employees, other than officers, and the amount of their compensation, or similar information.⁷

In determining whether a licensee has sufficient revenues to pay its regulatory fees, the Commission relies upon a licensee's cash flow, as opposed to the entity's profits. Thus, although deductions for amortization and depreciation, which do not affect cash flow, and payments to principals, reduce gross income for tax purposes, those deductions also represent money which is considered to be available to pay the regulatory fee.

In the absence of such documentation, or other relevant showing, you have failed to establish a compelling case for relief. Therefore, your request for a waiver of the FY 2008 regulatory fee for HBI is dismissed. Payment of the FY 2008 regulatory fee, totaling \$1,225.00, is now due. The regulatory fee should be filed together with a Form FCC 159 (copy enclosed) within 30 days from the date of this letter. However, in view of your allegations of financial hardship, in lieu of payment, you may refile HBI's request together with appropriate supporting documentation and a request to further defer payment of the fee, within 30 days from the date of this letter.





This is in response to your request dated August 8, 2008 (*Request*), filed on behalf of the now-dissolved entity, Paradigm Media, Inc. (Paradigm), for a waiver of the regulatory fees for earth station E980513 (the *Station*) for fiscal year (FYs) 2005, 2007, and 2008, as well as the associated penalties for late payment of the regulatory fees. Our records reflect that Paradigm did not pay the \$205.00, \$185.00, and \$195.00 regulatory fees for FYs 2005, 2007, and 2008, respectively, or the associated penalties in the amount of \$51.25, \$46.25, and \$48.75, respectively, in connection with the *Station*. For the reasons set forth below, we find no regulatory fees or penalties are due for FYs 2005, 2007, or 2008.

You state that Paradigm “was dissolved as of 12/17/03[.]”¹ You say that “[w]e have been advised by the representatives of the corporation that notice was provided to the FCC that all of the seven licenses issued to Paradigm [including the license for the *Station*] . . . were no longer needed prior to or at the time of the dissolution.”² You state that “[s]ubsequent to the dissolution, we have received requests for payment from the FCC and have responded that, to the best of our knowledge, all of the procedures necessary to notify the FCC that the corporation would no longer use the licenses had been completed.”³ You state that “on August 7, 2008, we were advised by FCC representatives that, although the FCC can locate proof that the other six call signs in the possession of Paradigm . . . were surrendered in a timely fashion, it cannot find any record of notice on the . . . callsign [*sic*] [for the *Station*].”⁴ You say that “we do not have

I represented Paradigm Media, Inc., 326 Sterling Browning, San Antonio, Texas 78232, CallSign E980513 while it was operating and in existence. This corporation was dissolved as of 12/17/03 and a copy of the articles of dissolution is attached for your convenience. We have been advised by the representatives of the corporation that notice was provided to the FCC that all of the seven licenses issued to Paradigm Media, Inc. were no longer needed prior to or at the time of the dissolution.

Subsequent to the dissolution, we have received requests for payment from the FCC and have responded that, to the best of our knowledge, all of the procedures necessary to notify the FCC that the corporation would no longer use the licenses had been completed. However, on August 7, 2008, we were advised by FCC representatives that, although the FCC can locate proof that the other six call signs in the possession of Paradigm Media, Inc. were surrendered in a timely fashion, it cannot find any record of notice on the above-referenced callsign.

This responds to your Petition filed September 23, 2008 on behalf of Wireless Telecommunications, Inc. and Wireless Telecommunications, Inc., Debtor-in-Possession (Wireless) requesting deferral and waiver of the fiscal year (FY) 2008 regulatory fees.¹ Our records reflect that Wireless has not paid the FY 2008 regulatory fees. As explained below, your request is granted.

In support of your request, you state that Wireless is in bankruptcy and on that basis previously obtained a waiver of the FY 2007 regulatory fees.² You state that Wireless' bankruptcy status "is still the same as it was at the time of the filings and correspondence" in connection with its previous waiver.³

The Commission will grant waivers of its regulatory fees on a sufficient showing of financial hardship. Evidence of bankruptcy or receivership at the time the fees are due is sufficient to establish financial hardship. See *Implementation of Section 9 of the Communications Act*, 10 FCC Rcd 12759, 12761-62 (1995) (waivers granted for licensees whose stations are bankrupt, undergoing Chapter 11 reorganization, or in receivership). Based on the documents you submitted concerning Wireless' bankruptcy status, we will grant a waiver of the regulatory fees for FY 2008.


