Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 23, 2009, PCIA–The Wireless Infrastructure Association (“PCIA”) and its members met with Office of General Counsel staff regarding the above-named proceedings. PCIA expressed its support for comments it filed with CTIA-The Wireless Association©, the National Association of Broadcasters and the National Association of Tower Erectors (the “Infrastructure Coalition Comments”). Specifically, PCIA urged the Commission to adopt new rules on an expedited basis to address the mandate of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit in *American Bird Conservancy, Inc. v. FCC*, 515 F.3d 1027 (D.C. Cir. 2008), including the establishment of a notice process for antenna structure registration applications. As discussed in the Infrastructure Coalition Comments, PCIA urged the Commission to prepare environmental assessments to initiate analysis of tower impacts on a regional basis. PCIA also discussed the continued appropriateness of categorical exclusions from the Commission’s antenna structure registration process given the gaps in comprehensive peer-reviewed scientific analysis.
