Pursuant to a request to AT&T from FCC staff, on Thursday, July 16, 2009, William Drexel and Joan Marsh of AT&T, Richard Rosen and Scott Feira of Arnold & Porter LLP, and William Randolph Smith of Crowell & Moring LLP, all representing AT&T, met with Neil Dellar, Jim Bird and Virginia Metallo of the FCC's Office of General Counsel, and Erin McGrath, Susan Singer, Pramesh Jobanputra, Stacy Ferraro and Stana Kimball of the FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. The purpose of the meeting was to provide information regarding AT&T's relationship with América Móvil and how that relationship has benefitted consumers in the US and abroad and is in the public interest. AT&T also explained why its relationship with América Móvil is not an issue, and presents no competitive concerns, with respect to AT&T's pending merger with Centennial Communications.
