ENFORCEMENT BUREAU'S COMMENTS
on
REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

1. By e-mail, dated July 28, 2009,¹ the Presiding Judge requested the Enforcement Bureau ("Bureau") to comment by one o'clock on July 29, 2009, on "why it might be appropriate" for him to grant the Motion to Amend Scheduling Order ("MASN Extension Request"), filed July 27, 2009, by TCR Sports Broadcasting Holding, L.L.P. d/b/a Mid-Atlantic Sports Network ("MASN"). The MASN Extension Request seeks a one-week extension of time, until August 7, 2009, for the Bureau to file its post-hearing comments in this proceeding.

2. Although it appears from their respective filings² that the captioned parties disagree on the imminence and likelihood of a settlement, the Bureau has no independent knowledge or understanding of the extent to which they are and have been engaged in settlement negotiations. Nevertheless, the Bureau concurs with the Presiding Judge with respect to the high public interest in



case resolution by settlement and agrees in principle with a limited extension of time to accommodate the good faith efforts of the captioned parties and their counsel to attempt to negotiate a settlement of this complex dispute. Furthermore, the Bureau does not believe that such a brief extension will materially impair the Presiding Judge's ability to issue a Recommended Decision on an expedited basis in the event such settlement negotiations are unsuccessful.

3. Therefore, as indicated in the MASN Extension Request, the Bureau does not oppose MASN's request for relief.
