ORDER

As directed in a post-hearing scheduling Order, on July 31, 2009,¹ the Enforcement Bureau ("Bureau") filed its Non-Public Comments on the hearing evidence and on the merits of the non-government parties proposed findings and conclusion and replies. *See Order FCC 09M-43*, released May 27, 2009.

On July 30, 2009, the Bureau made an informal request by e-mail asking to delay filing a redacted version of Comments until after the non-government parties have an opportunity to request redactions. Such redaction requests of MASN and Comcast would be made by August 7, 2009, with the Bureau to later file its Public (Redacted) Comments on August 12, 2009.


Soon after receipt of the Bureau's e-mail, the Presiding Judge granted the informal request on August 1st via return e-mail. *See 47 CFR §1.298(a) (ex parte time extensions)*. The Bureau's request was deemed reasonable in time. Also, similar e-mail request for delay in filings to accommodate redactions had been granted to MASN and Comcast on July 6, 2009. The Bureau deserves the same consideration.

Accordingly IT IS ORDERED that any request for deletion of privileged matter from Bureau of Enforcement Comments must be communicated to the Enforcement Bureau by MASN and/or Comcast by **August 7, 2009**.

¹ A recent Motion filed by MASN seeking to delay the Bureau's filing until after settlement negotiation session to be held on August 4 was denied. *See Order FCC 09M-49*, released July 30, 2009.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any Public (Redacted) Comments of the Enforcement Bureau to the Enforcement Bureau must be placed on the public record by **August 12, 2009**.
