Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of Verizon Wireless, John Scott, Vice President & Deputy General Counsel – Regulatory Law, Don Brittingham, Assistant Vice President, and the undersigned met with David Goldman, Office of Chairman Julius Genachowski, on August 31, 2009 to discuss the pressing need to eliminate wireless microphone operations in the 700 MHz band.

Verizon Wireless noted that it will launch commercial service using LTE technology in the 700 MHz band in 30 cities in mid-year 2010, and limited testing and operation of the technology is occurring in some markets already.¹ Further, public safety has already deployed networks in 40-plus markets, with many more on the way.² The record demonstrates that continued wireless microphone operations in the band (whether users are currently authorized or unauthorized) will result in interference and disruption of service to First Responders, broadband consumers, and wireless microphone users themselves. Consistent with its previous filings in the above-captioned proceedings, Verizon Wireless urged the Commission to act swiftly to eliminate authorized and unauthorized wireless microphone operations in the 700 MHz band.
