REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

Zayo Enterprise Networks, LLC (FCC FRN No. 0015-3316-89), Onvoy, Inc. (FCC FRN Np. 0004-3230-28), Zayo Bandwidth Northeast (FCC FRN No. 0005-9296-09), Zayo Bandwidth Central, LLC (FCC FRN No. 0009-7275-12) (hereafter referred to collectively as “Zayo”) respectfully request a 20-day extension of time to September 21, 2009, to complete and file the Form 477 due September 1, 2009.


Zayo acknowledges the importance of the information being requested by FCC in the Form 477 as well as the need to have this information provided in a timely manner. However, the information being requested in the as previously revised Form 477, and the related information gathering process, represents significant departures from what was required to complete the prior forms. As such, the process of completing the revised Form 477 has placed a substantial burden and hardship on Zayo to complete by September 1, 2009, for the following reasons: 1) a significant portion of the increased information and data required is not currently kept in the ordinary course of business, 2) being a small provider, the information gathering requirements have necessitated that several personnel abandon existing customer focused job functions in order to gather Form 477 information, and 3) the software reprogramming to accommodate the information needed to accurately complete the filing has been ongoing and encountered several obstacles. We are still required to perform many manual processes.

Zayo is a small telecommunications provider based in Colorado with approximately 500 customers. Zayo has filed all past Form 477s in a timely manner. However, the census tract data now required in the revised Form 477 is not currently being tracked by Zayo, nor does Zayo currently have an automated system to track it if it was available information. This has required Zayo to devote several employees to manually look up each customer address and then manually look up the census tract code.

Zayo is committed to providing the information required in the Form 477, and continues to devote employee time to completion of the Form 477 as quickly and accurately as possible. However, given the amount and nature of the information being requested, Zayo does not believe it has the time or resources to accurately complete the Form 477 by September 1, 2009. With a 20-day extension to file Zayo believes it can accurately provide all the requested information, as well as establish the needed procedures to more efficiently prepare future Form 477s. By granting this extension to Zayo, the Commission would be benefiting the public interest by allowing Zayo to provide more accurate data.

In conclusion, for the foregoing reasons, Zayo requests the Commission grant it a 20 day extension of time to submit its revised Form 477 filing, currently due September 1, 2009. If the Form 477 is successfully completed prior to the expiration of the 20 day extension, it will be submitted at that time.
