
Re: Clarity Broadcasting Application for Review DA 07-1946,

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, September 17, 2009, David Donovan, and Victor Tawil of the Association for Maximum Service Television, Inc. (MSTV) met with the following members of the Media Bureau: Mr. William Lake, Chief of the Media Bureau, Ms. Eloise Gore, Ms. Barbara Kreisman, and Mr. Jon Wong.

We outlined MSTV's concerns about the proposed waivers by Clarity Broadcasting to reallocate -- by waiver -- spectrum now used for broadcasting electronic news gathering. We noted that the waivers propose a use that is completely inconsistent with the current BAS allocation. We observed that even with the proposed lower power levels, such a reallocation would cause interference and prevent local news gathering functions. Our specific concern was the desensitization of our receive sites. Because of this interference, the effective range of our ENG trucks would be reduced. Moreover, news crews would not know in advance whether they would be able to report news from a specific location. Clarity's proposed national call-in line to report problems is not a real solution for the presentation of live local emergency news. We reiterated that live local coverage, especially during emergencies, was at the core of local broadcasting. No materials regarding the Clarity proceedings were distributed at this meeting.
