On October 2, 2009, the undersigned of this Firm together with Dan Glickman and Frank Cavaliere of the Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. ("MPAA") met with Commissioner Baker and William Freedman of Commissioner Baker's office to discuss matters relating to the national broadband plan and to the use of selectable output control ("SOC") technology as part of the above-referenced proceedings.

In particular, we discussed the points made MPAA's comments in GN Docket No. 09-51, particularly with respect to the role that protection of content online plays in broadband adoption. We also discussed MPAA's waiver petition related to SOC, submitted to the Commission on May 9, 2008, and MPAA's reply comments in the proceeding, submitted to the Commission on July 31, 2008, both of which explained that the pro-consumer purpose of the requested waiver is to enable movie studios to offer millions of Americans in-home access to high-value, high definition video content.
