Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 5, 2009, Mark E. Crosby, President and CEO, Enterprise Wireless Alliance (“EWA”) met with the following representatives of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau: Monica Desai, Deputy Bureau Chief; Jane Jackson, Associate Bureau Chief; Roger Noel, Division Chief, Mobility Division (“MD”); and Scot Stone, Deputy Division Chief, MD.

The parties’ discussion included the following:

1. 800 MHz
  - EWA Petition for Rulemaking filed on April 29, 2009, requesting the initiation of a proceeding to provide for the assignment of new, full-power interstitial 12.5 kHz channels between currently authorized 25 kHz bandwidth channels at 854-861/809-816 MHz.
  - The anticipated release of additional vacated Sprint spectrum resulting from 800 MHz rebanding efforts.
2. 900 MHz (WT 05-62) Joint EWA and Sprint Petition for Clarification submitted on December 17, 2008, seeking clarification or reconsideration of the application process for new 900 MHz systems.

3. Part 90 Amendments (WP 07-100) and Narrowbanding (WT 99-87)

- The status of adoption of rules addressing non-public safety-related issues in WP 07-100 and issuance of a Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in response to rule changes proposed by the LMCC to rewrite FCC Rule Section 90.187 to facilitate the deployment of a variety of 6.25 kHz and 6.25 kHz(e) technologies and to clarify the rules governing trunking in the VHF/UHF bands.
- The status of a Public Notice requested by the industry to be released on or before December 31, 2009, providing guidance to licensees about the January 1, 2013, narrowband conversion deadline and announcing associated licensing procedures and requirements.
- Industry Canada is returning applications that have simply modified emission designators to conform to narrowbanding rules with “HIA” rejection.

4. CPNI (CB 09-102) The status of FCC clarification of the applicability of CPNI rules to telecommunication carriers that do not provide interconnection with the PSTN.

This letter is being filed electronically, in accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission’s Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b), for inclusion in the record in this proceeding.
