Chairman Genachowski:

We write to you today because of our concern over the FCC's proposed rulemaking regarding network neutrality. While we support the Commission's goal of maintaining a free and open Internet, we are concerned that imposing a network neutrality rule will negatively impact the ability of minority communities to access broadband networks.

African-Americans are using the Internet in greater numbers than ever before – in fact, African-American mobile Internet usage has grown significantly – more than doubling in the last two years. And yet, black Americans still lag behind both white and Hispanic-Americans in Internet accessibility and on-line usage.

President Obama has established universal adoption as one of his Administration's technological goals, meaning that every American should have access to broadband.

If network neutrality is enacted, it will necessitate the raising of prices on high-speed Internet, making it even more difficult, or even impossible, for minority and underprivileged communities to get online.

The Internet is an essential tool in the modern world. It has enabled people to access a wide range of educational tools, employment opportunities, and entertainment options. We ask that the Commission carefully consider the consequences of net neutrality before moving ahead with any rule that will unintentionally widen the digital divide.
