Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 10, 2009, Mitch Glazier, Executive Vice President of Government and Industry Relations, the Recording Industry Association of America, Cary Sherman, President of the Recording Industry Association of America, Jennifer Jacobson of Sony Music, Inc., Matthew Gerson of Universal Music Group, and Jill Lesser of Glover Park Group met with Senior Counselor Colin Crowell, Chief Counsel and Senior Legal Advisor to Chairman Genachowski.

In that meeting, these individuals discussed the importance of content protection as a component of reasonable network management, and the role of network operators in discouraging the unlawful transfer of copyrighted content. We discussed the utility and concerns with technical measures depending on whether they are being used at the network level or at the individual subscriber level.

They also reiterated MusicFIRST's comments and reply comments the proceeding titled *In the Matter of Petition Regarding the Actions of Certain Radio Broadcasters in Opposition to the Performance Rights Act* and urged the Commission to consider these comments in connection with any license renewal proceedings or license renewal terms for radio stations.
