Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 12, 2009 I spoke on the telephone to Austin Schlick, General Counsel, regarding whether, in light of the November 6, 2009 letter from the American Bird Conservancy, Defenders of Wildlife and the National Audubon Society, the Infrastructure Coalition wished to reconsider its decision to continue discussions regarding interim procedures for the processing of Antenna Survey Registrations as the Commission continues its evaluation of migratory bird issues.

I related to Mr. Schlick that the Infrastructure Coalition continues to be willing to engage in such discussions but that it considers several of the suggestions contained in the November 6, 2009 letter to be antithetical to productive discussions. For example, the Infrastructure Coalition believes that the introduction of other agencies into the discussion of interim procedures at this initial stage would have the unintended effect of prematurely hardening parties' positions rather than fostering candid conversation that is often the prelude to successful discussions. Further, I related that while the Infrastructure Coalition believes that an aspirational date for completion of the process would be laudable, the imposition of a fixed deadline would not encourage productive discussions and would rob the process of the flexibility it needs to succeed.
