Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 16, 2009, representatives of MusicFIRST met with Commissioner Robert McDowell and Legal Advisor Rosemary Harold and, in a separate meeting, with Commissioner Meredith Attwell Baker, Legal Advisor Brad Gillen, and Confidential Assistant and Staff Attorney Millie Kerr. The representatives of musicFIRST attending the meeting with Commissioner McDowell and Ms. Harold were Mitch Bainwol and Mitch Glazier of the Recording Industry Association of America, Matthew Gerson of Universal Music Group, Daryl Friedman of The Recording Academy, Penny Nance on behalf of the Christian Music Trade Association, Mitch Rose of Mitch Rose Strategic Consulting, and the undersigned. The same group attended the meeting with Commissioner Attwell Baker, Mr. Gillen, and Ms. Kerr, but were also joined by Chris Israel of PCT Government Relations.

In both meetings, the MusicFIRST representatives reiterated the points made in MusicFIRST's comments and reply comments that certain broadcasters are violating their public interest obligations as well as the Commission's public disclosure rules. They urged the Commission to investigate these matters and to consider the findings in connection with relevant license renewal proceedings.
