On behalf of QUALCOMM Incorporated (“Qualcomm”), this is to report that yesterday, November 23, 2009, Dr. Paul Jacobs, Chairman and CEO of Qualcomm, and I met with FCC staff members Blair Levin, Erik Garr, John Leibovitz, Nick Sinai, Charles Worthington, Mohit Kaushal, Rebecca Hanson, Jessica Strott, Arnab Das, Andrew Nesi, Carol Matthey, Peter Bowen, Mindel de la Torre, Adam Gerson, Millie Kerr, David Goldman, Jordan Usdan, Kevin Bennett, Kristen Kane, Mukul Chawla, Pierce Graham Jones, Scott Wallsten, Spencer Hutchins, Sridhar Prasad, Steve Rosenberg, Tom Brown, Vishal Doshi, Elvis Stumbergs, and Rebekah Goodheart.

During the meeting, Dr. Jacobs provided background information on various mobile broadband technologies, products, and services. He showed the staff members Qualcomm’s mirasol display technology in an e-reader format. Mirasol-based e-readers will have dramatically longer battery life and will support video in addition to text and audio, thereby enabling many innovative educational and other uses of this new generation of e-readers. In addition, Dr. Jacobs showed the staff members a smartphone using Qualcomm’s Snapdragon chipset with advanced mobile broadband computing capabilities. Moreover, Dr. Jacobs showed a personal mobile TV device using Qualcomm’s FLO technology which is now on the market.

Dr. Jacobs reiterated the need for the identification, allocation, and auction of additional licensed spectrum to meet the exponential growth in usage of mobile broadband. All of his comments were fully consistent with the positions taken, and arguments made, in Qualcomm’s pleadings in the above-referenced proceedings.
