Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Tuesday, December 1, 2009, I spoke via telephone with Bruce Gottlieb, Chief Counsel and Senior Legal Advisor and David Goldman, Acting Legal Advisor to Chairman Julius Genachowski.

During the conversation, I discussed wireless emergency alerts and recent requests calling upon the Commission to investigate FM chips in wireless devices for alerting purposes. I explained that, during the WARN Act Advisory Committee process, numerous different communications media advocated placement of their technologies into mobile devices for reception of emergency alerts, including FM chipsets, video broadcasting, paging and satellite. I further noted that the Advisory Committee carefully considered these various technologies and concluded that incorporating them was unworkable or would not accomplish the country's goal of reliable reception of alerts without creating additional challenges. I also reiterated commitments to develop and deploy timely wireless emergency alerts provided the standards issued by the Department of Homeland Security and Federal Emergency Management Agency reflect those recommended by the Advisory Committee.

Additionally, I discussed the wireless industry's interest in the FCC initiating a proceeding to investigate the reallocation of broadcast spectrum, pursuant to Congress's mandate in Section 336(g) of the Communications Act.
