On December 8, 2009, Larry Alder, Minnie Ingersoll, Anjali Joshi, Derek Slater, Richard Whitt, and the undersigned of Google Inc. ("Google representatives") met with Bruce Gottlieb, Chief Counsel and Senior Legal Advisor to Chairman Julius Genachowski; Priya Aiyar, Legal Advisor for Wireline Competition and International Issues to Chairman Genachowski; Sherrese Smith, Legal Advisor for Media, Consumer and Enforcement Issues to Chairman Genachowski; and David Goldman of Chairman Genachowski's office. The Google representatives discussed Google's extensive involvement with the agency in support of the National Broadband Plan. In particular the Google representatives shared various ideas to: (1) increase the deployment and uptake of high-capacity fiber to consumers; (2) enhance Internet accessibility for consumers through set-top boxes and other devices; and (3) address the current spectrum-constrained environment by increasing the inventory of spectrum available for both licensed and unlicensed usage, and furthering the development of the TV white spaces by expeditiously implementing a geolocation database regime.
