

Dear Ms. Dortch:

In a December 16, 2009 *ex parte* filing in the above-captioned docket, AT&T Services, Inc. (“AT&T”) submitted a copy of its program access complaint against Cablevision Corporation (“Cablevision”) and Madison Square Garden, L.P. (“MSG”), purportedly to place “evidence in the record of [this] proceeding regarding the marketplace effects of exclusive access arrangements for terrestrially-delivered regional sports programming.” Cablevision and MSG’s answer to AT&T’s complaint makes clear, however, that AT&T’s claim of harm is factually and legally unfounded and that in fact Cablevision’s ability to provide high definition (“HD”) programming on an exclusive basis enhanced competition by promoting Cablevision’s and MSG’s investment and innovation in programming. The public version of the answer is attached.
