Dear Chairman Genachowski and Commissioners:

The Denver Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, comprised of Hispanic business owners, corporate executives, government officials and community leaders has over 2,100 members, and is the state's largest minority chamber, and one of the top four chambers of commerce in metro Denver.

The Hispanic Chamber supports the development and growth of member businesses through initiatives that encourage and promote business and economic development. In addition, the Hispanic Chamber is a strong advocate of legislation affecting small businesses. As such, we have taken a special interest in recent discussions by the FCC to impose net neutrality regulations (GN Docket No. 09-191). Bearing in mind the impact widespread regulation could bring, I urge you to give careful consideration to possible repercussions. If imposed hastily, such regulation could measurably impact local businesses, schools, and households.

Like any widespread regulatory action, it's possible the proposed changes could threaten broadband access, competition, and investment opportunities. Open access to broadband services is essential for small businesses, and even more so, for minority business owners, to exist as a competitive and self-sustaining entity.

Any possibility of expanding the digital divide between small businesses and minority groups should be carefully considered, as it stands to impact our wellbeing and the economic vitality of this critical segment of the American economy and population.

As the voice of minority business owners in the Denver area, and an advocate of ensuring equal and level playing fields for all Americans, I urge you to carefully consider net neutrality regulations.
