Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 8, 2010, Brian Roberts, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Comcast Corporation ("Comcast"), spoke with Chairman Genachowski regarding the following matters.

Mr. Roberts and Chairman Genachowski acknowledged the various retransmission consent disputes that arose at the end of 2009 and discussed whether the current system may be in need of reform. Mr. Roberts noted that a number of developments are contributing to make the retransmission consent process more contentious, but he cautioned that he does not believe there are any quick fixes in this area, and that the Commission and various stakeholders should work together to examine whether different approaches are needed.

With respect to navigation device issues, Mr. Roberts urged that, should the Commission desire to consider possible next steps, it should launch a Notice of Inquiry ("NOI") to examine the many complex issues implicated. Mr. Roberts suggested that the NOI be broader and more comprehensive than the very limited questions asked as part of the National Broadband Plan.

Mr. Roberts and Chairman Genachowski also discussed the National Broadband Plan and the Commission's rulemaking on net neutrality, with Mr. Roberts reiterating positions previously expressed by Comcast on both matters.
