New proposed rules on "net neutrality" are designed to – amongst other things – promote additional competition in the marketplace. But these efforts are entirely counterproductive.



Clearly, the current system is working well for consumers and businesses alike, making net neutrality completely unnecessary. In fact, by implementing proposed net neutrality rules, there would be a disincentive for internet companies to improve their services or expand their service areas.
