The presentations involved providing details of CTB's proposal to provide broadcast, conditional access television, and broadband using digital television station broadcast signals with cellularized transmission facilities, as previously described in CTB's comments, reply comments, and rulemaking petition:



In addition, CTB asked questions and made suggestions regarding procedures for filing and processing applications for experimental authorizations to test and evaluate its technology, including the need for flexibility in selecting and relocating transmitter sites without having to specify the location and operating parameters of each individual transmitter site and how to demonstrate that operations will not cause prohibited interference to any other station. CTB noted the constraints on its plans imposed by a combination of the absence of final distributed transmission system rules for low power television stations and postponement of the lifting of geographic restrictions on filing applications for new low power television stations.
