On January 22, 2010, Stan Glasgow, President and Chief Operating Officer, Michael T. Williams, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, John Dolak, Vice President, Corporate Communications, and Joel Wiginton, Vice President and Senior Counsel, Government and Industry Affairs, from Sony Electronics Inc. ("SEL"), met with Commissioner Michael J. Copps and Jennifer Schneider, Broadband, Wireline and Universal Service Legal Advisor to Commissioner Copps, to discuss the above-referenced proceeding.

Consistent with the comments filed by SEL in this proceeding, the SEL representatives reiterated the company's support for the Commission's proposed rules to preserve an open, safe and secure Internet. They noted that SEL has invested heavily to enhance the consumer value of its products by implementing Internet connectivity, with the expectation that consumers will continue to have unfettered access to the legal content, applications and services of their choice. SEL believes that the Commission's proposed network neutrality rules, if implemented, would encourage broadband deployment and greater consumer uptake of broadband connectivity
