Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 25, 2010, the undersigned, K. James Yager, CEO, Barrington Broadcasting Group, LLC and Elizabeth Murphy Burns, President, Morgan Murphy Stations, met, in separate meetings, with Commissioner Michael Copps and his Legal Advisors, Jamila Bess Johnson and Joshua Cinelli, and Commissioner Meredith Attwell Baker and her legal Advisor, Brad Gillen. The parties discussed the FCC's national broadband report and various proposals for potential reallocation of spectrum to support wireless broadband services in the future. The broadcast parties emphasized that broadcasting is a critical part of the communications future. The broadcasters also described some current and planned broadcaster uses for spectrum currently allocated for over-the-air broadcast service, including high definition programming and mobile digital television services. Mr. Yager cited to innovative services that Barrington Broadcasting offers, such as a full-time local Spanish multicast channel on KGBT-TV in Harlingen, TX.

Additionally, we discussed the upcoming quadrennial ownership review and the impact the media landscape has on local television stations, particularly on small markets, and their ability to deliver local programming, including news services. We stressed that the review should reflect today's economic realities and challenges.
