Our clients depend on interference free microphones during large general sessions and smaller breakout rooms where continuing education is key for Veteran's care and national defense classes. If attendees cannot hear or understand presenters due to interference then we have ultimately wasted their time and done a disservice to them.

I would ask that any changes that the FCC makes to its current rules governing the use of wireless microphones would allow us as a company to obtain a FCC wireless microphone license so that we can continue to operate with the efficiency our clients have come to expect from us.
