On Friday, February 5, 2010, I discussed Cisco's February 1, 2010 ex parte filing with FCC staff member Nick Sinai of the National Broadband Plan team.¹ The conversation occurred via telephone. I reviewed the key points of Cisco's February 1 filing, stating that Cisco's filing did not oppose utility-assigned spectrum for smart grid, and that we believe the FCC should examine the utility-provided information about their business models and use cases in considering what recommendation the FCC wants to make to Congress about the allocation of such spectrum.
