Dear Chairman Genachowski:

I am the Music Pastor at a House of Worship in Muskegon Michigan called Central Assembly of God. I am writing to ask the FCC to protect wireless microphones from interference and to ensure that wireless microphone users will be eligible for licenses.

We use wireless microphones during many functions at our Church at our main facility as well as at our Children's Ministry building and our Youth Ministry building, 3 locations in all. We record all of our services for re-broadcast weekly. In addition to our weekly services on Sundays, Mondays & Wednesdays, we have special services that are open to the community including Concerts with live bands, theatrical performances, as well as Battle of the Bands competitions.

It is important that we continue to have crystal clear communication with our congregations/audiences. It allows us to freely move on stage, which is especially important during our theatrical events. Interference during these events would be catastrophic to the excellence we try to provide for our church and to the service we provide for the community.

I would ask that you would ensure that any rule changes that the FCC adopts would allow us to obtain an FCC wireless microphone license and allow us to continue doing the functions we are providing for our congregation as well as the services to the community we provide at no charge.
