Amendment of Parts 15, 74, and 90 of the Commission's Rules Regarding Low
Power Auxiliary Stations, Including Wireless Microphones
WT Docket Nos. 08-166, 08-167; ET Docket No. 10-24

Dear Chairman Genachowski:

I work for Miami Dade College, which is an educational institution with eight campuses. I am writing you to ask you to have the FCC protect wireless microphones from interference. Also, I request that you allow users like us at Miami Dade College the opportunity to be eligible for licenses.

We use wireless microphones for professors, vocalists, musicians, and actors. Many of our events are videotaped, and we use wireless microphones to record the audio. Some of our productions have been edited and broadcasted on television. We continually have musicians and lecturers on campus who use our wireless microphones in their events. We recently hosted the 3rd Annual Latin Jazz Festival. This week, for one of our Black Heritage month's events (the Cotton Club), we will use five handheld wireless microphones.

Interference-free operations are vital for us. Many of our events are recorded for later use and interference on the recording would ruin the finished product. Presenters are used to the freedom that wireless microphones give them; we are providing them with what they want. Please do not restrict their freedom. Please ensure that any changes the FCC makes will allow us to obtain an FCC license so we can continue to provide quality educational material to our students, faculty, staff, and community.
