Dear Secretary Dortch:

On February 26, the undersigned met with Blair Levin, Phil Bellaria and Rebecca Hanson of the FCC's Broadband Task Force. Ms. Mago indicated that her purpose in asking for the meeting was to understand the process for moving forward with the National Broadband Plan and expected rulemakings to implement parts of the plan, such as the mobile future auction discussed by Chairman Genachowski in remarks before the New America Foundation. She reiterated the broadcasters' position that the one-to-many service they provide remains a vital part of the national communications eco-system, that broadcasters are continuing to fully utilize the spectrum licensed to them, and indeed continue to develop new and innovative ways to serve the public. She indicated that input from broadcasters will be very important to understanding the full ramifications of any changes in spectrum policy and that broadcasters will be part of the ongoing dialogue. Broadcasters are committed to working with the FCC and Congress to implement spectrum policies that will allow the American public to reap both the full benefits of the digital television transition and broadband technology.
