REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

Windjammer Communications LLC (“Windjammer”) respectfully requests a 14-day extension of time to March 15, 2010 to complete and file the revised Form 477 due March 1, 2010.

Windjammer acknowledges the importance of the information being requested by the FCC in the revised Form 477 as well as the need to have this information provided in a timely manner. However, the information being requested in the revised Form 477, and the related information gathering process, represents significant departures from what was required to complete the earlier forms. As such, the process of completing the revised Form 477 has placed a substantial burden and hardship on Windjammer to complete by March 1, 2010, for the following reasons: 1) a significant portion of the increased information and data required is not currently kept in the ordinary course of business, and 2) being a small cable operator, the information gathering requirements have necessitated that several personnel abandon existing customer-focused job functions in order to gather Form 477 information.

Windjammer is a small cable television operator based in Jupiter, Florida, with approximately 70,000 cable television subscribers. In late 2008 Windjammer acquired its

subscriber base from Time Warner Cable, and has personnel experienced with the Form 477 requirements. The census tract data now required in the revised Form 477 is not currently being tracked by Windjammer, nor does Windjammer currently have an automated system to track it if it was available information. This situation has required Windjammer to devote the time of several employees to assemble the subscriber addresses for geocoding to obtain the census tract information.

Windjammer is committed to providing the information required in the Form 477, and continues to devote employee and contractor time to completion of the Form 477 as quickly and accurately as possible. However, given the amount and nature of the information being requested, Windjammer does not believe that it has the time or resources to accurately complete the Form 477 by March 1, 2010. With a 14-day extension to file, Windjammer believes it can accurately provide all the requested information, as well as establish the procedures necessary to more efficiently prepare future Form 477s. By granting this extension to Windjammer, the Commission would be benefiting the public interest by allowing Windjammer to provide more accurate data.

In conclusion, for the foregoing reasons, Windjammer requests the Commission grant it a 14-day extension of time to submit its revised Form 477 filing, currently due March 1, 2010. If the Form 477 data are successfully available prior to the expiration of the 14-day extension, it will be submitted at that time.
