Re: Comments to Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking  
Amendment of Parts 15, 74, and 90 of the Commission's Rules Regarding Low Power Auxiliary Stations,  
Including Wireless Microphones

Dear Chairman Genachowski:

I am writing to ask that the FCC protect wireless microphones from radiated and conducted interference. In addition, I would request the FCC ensure that wireless microphone users have a streamlined license application process. I am an engineering professional who provides technical consulting services to the information technology industry. My business focuses on the technologies used in live and installed sound, houses of worship, broadcast, and film where wireless technology is pervasive. It is used for microphones, intercoms, and in-ear monitoring that provide artists the freedom of movement and safety whether they are vocalists, speakers, or instrumentalists. Production staff uses wireless technology for continuous command, control, and safety during the rehearsals and the actual performances, broadcasts and events. It is critical that these devices are free from interference from both a safety and artistic point of view.

The change from the 700 MHz band for these devices has already caused a significant hardship on many users during these hard economic times. It is imperative that the FCC ensure that compliance with these new rules does not cause any further economic damage due to equipment performance degradation caused by EMI or EMC issues in the new allocated bandwidth. The FCC can also help reduce the financial burden of these changes by creating a streamlined licensing process.
