This is to inform you that, on February 25, 2010 Vincent Sadusky, CEO of LIN Television Corporation (“LIN”), Rebecca Duke, LIN’s Vice President of Distribution, and I met with Blair Levin and Rebecca Hanson of the FCC’s Omnibus Broadband Initiative.


We discussed LIN’s comments previously filed in these dockets and, in particular, we emphasized the following points:

- The FCC’s National Broadband Plan should conspicuously state that free, over-the-air television broadcasting is a core national communications service that should be preserved and enhanced.
- The FCC’s broadcast ownership rules and its inflexible technical regulations hinder efforts of television broadcasters to adapt to the changing needs and expectations of consumers. Relaxing or eliminating these rules will promote the delivery of advanced communications services, including broadband, to all Americans.
- Broadcasters would be far more likely to support proposed regulatory changes that address these anachronistic regulations.
