On behalf of Sprint Nextel Corporation, Lawrence Krevor, Richard Engelman, and Trey Hanbury met yesterday with James Barnett, Jennifer Manner, Erika Olsen, and David Furth of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau.

The Bureau representatives described elements of the National Broadband Plan for public safety. Key elements include permitting multiple carriers to compete for the opportunity to meet public safety's broadband requirements; obtaining federal support for network construction in high-cost and high-risk areas; and establishing a forum to identify and refine technical requirements that can permit roaming and preemptive access for public safety broadband users. Sprint Nextel's representatives reiterated their support for key elements of the plan and encouraged the FCC to support public-private partnerships for 4G wireless broadband on a band-neutral, technology-neutral, and competitively neutral basis.
