As is the case with satellite television, the broadcaster of satellite television is free at anytime to enter into confidential agreements with subscribers to not intercept there signal. Once the agreement is in place, the subscriber then is limited in choice in the market in which he/she lives to any other available cable companies which remain. Such contractual agreements which bar the individual through confidential agreement from using a cable company or satellite company. antitrust, a very good reason to make competition is slighted when cable or satellite companies pick and choose who they wish to bar from service with out good reason. While we open a new spectrum for radio, such transmission should be open to all even if for a fee and remain open to all unless justifiable reasons exist to restrict service to individuals. .
