**HAWAIIAN TELCOM, INC. AND
HAWAIIAN TELCOM SERVICES COMPANY, INC.
REQUEST FOR EXTENSION**

Hawaiian Telcom, Inc. (“HTI”) and Hawaiian Telcom Services Company, Inc. (“HT Services,” and together with HTI, the “Applicants”) hereby respectfully request a seven-day extension of time to respond to comments on their Applications for Transfer of Control. The Commission’s Public Notice set March 24, 2010 and March 31, 2010 as the deadlines for comments and reply comments on the Applications, respectively.¹ Time Warner Cable (“TWC”) filed comments on March 24, 2010, in which it made a number of factual allegations regarding Applicants’ compliance with the Commission’s rules concerning pole attachments, conduits, and ducts.

Since these comments were filed, Applicants have been diligently researching the factual questions raised by the comments. Because the allegations are vague and do not

include the specific incidents or dates about which TWC is complaining, Applicants have not been able to complete that investigation in the four business days since the comments were filed. Applicants therefore request a brief extension of seven days, until April 7, to file their reply to these comments. Grant of this request is in the public interest because it will allow Applicants sufficient time to research and respond fully to TWC's claims, and the delay will be only for a short period. A complete response to TWC's allegations will ensure that the Commission has a complete record on which to make its decision.

Therefore, Applicants respectfully request that the reply deadline be extended until April 7, 2010.
