Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, April 8, 2010, Cristina Pauzé of Time Warner Cable Inc. (“TWC”) and I met with Brad Gillen and Millie Kerr from Commissioner Meredith Baker’s office. At the meeting, TWC discussed its positions on the recommendations in the National Broadband Plan that the Commission initiate (1) a notice of inquiry concerning whether multichannel video programming distributors (“MVPDs”) should be required to install “gateway” devices in subscribers’ homes, and (2) a rulemaking proceeding to address certain issues related to CableCARDS. TWC applauded the Commission for recognizing that any requirements regarding gateway devices must apply to all MVPDs, and stated that it looks forward to participating in the NOI proceeding to address the many issues associated with implementing any efforts regarding gateway devices. Also, TWC urged the Commission to consider the significant costs and very limited benefits associated with the proposed requirement that an IP return path be installed in some video devices.
