State Telephone Company (Company) hereby provides notice that it plans to cease offering Wireline Broadband Internet Access Service (WBIAS) on a tariff basis. Effective July 1, 2010 the Company plans to offer permissive detariffed WBIAS on a Title II Common-Carriage basis pursuant to paragraph 94 of the Federal Communications Commission's Wireline Broadband Order¹.

The geographic areas affected are the Company exchanges, Ravena and Coxsackie, where WBIAS is technically feasible.

The only customer for the Company's WBIAS is the Company's affiliate nonregulated Internet Service Provider ("ISP") operation. The affiliate purchases WBIAS for use as a component in its broadband internet service sold to residential and business customers. The discontinuance of the tariff offering of WBIAS will have no effect on the end user service provided by the affiliate.

The company will continue to make WBIAS available on a common-carriage basis. Rates, terms and conditions of service will be available at the Company's business office located at 46 Reed Street Coxsackie, NY 12051, and on the Company's website at <http://www.statetel.com>.


