On April 27, 2010, George Rose, Executive Vice President and Chief Public Policy Officer of Activision Blizzard, Inc. ("AB"), Gail Markels, Markels Strategies, and Tom Davidson, counsel for AB, met with Joshua Cinelli, Media Advisor, Office of Commissioner Michael Copps, Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"). The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the comments and reply comments filed in the above-referenced docket. During the meeting, AB explained that there was no public interest basis for the FCC to intervene in the regulation of video games because the video game industry's self-regulatory efforts are adequate to empower parents to make educated decisions regarding their children's access to, and use of, video games. AB described the detailed and effective Entertainment System Rating Board's ratings system that the video game industry has voluntarily employed to provide parents with necessary information to make informed decisions. AB also discussed the existing parental controls employed to empower parents to manage children's access to video games. Finally, AB noted the lack of the FCC's jurisdiction to regulate video games, and that any effort by the FCC to do so would violate the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.
