On Tuesday May 4, 2010, James Cicconi, Senior Executive Vice President – External & Legislative Affairs, and I met with Commissioner Robert McDowell, Chief of Staff and Senior Legal Adviser Angela Giancarlo and Policy Director and Wireline Counsel Christine Kurth. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss issues related to the aforementioned proceedings and specifically to discuss the impact of the recent decision in *Comcast v. FCC*, No. 08-1291, slip op. (DC Cir. April 6, 2010).

In particular, we discussed the positions regarding Title 2 regulation of broadband services expressed in the *ex parte* submissions of February 22, 2010, April 12, 2010, April 29, 2010 to which AT&T was a signatory.
