Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 5, 2010, Patricia Cooper, President, Satellite Industry Association (SIA); Audrey Allison, The Boeing Company; Peter Corea, DBSD; Linda Kinney, EchoStar Satellite LLC; Steve Doiron, Hughes Network Systems; Stephen Baruch, Lerman Center for Hughes Network Systems; Christopher Murphy, Inmarsat, Inc.; James Kramer, Integral Systems, Inc.; Sue Crandall, Intelsat, Ltd.; Jennifer Hindin, Wiley Rein for Intelsat Ltd.; Giselle Creeser, Lockheed Martin Corporation; Daniel Mah, SES World Skies; Alexandra Field, Terrestrial Networks, Inc.; and, Glenn Richards, Pillsbury for SkyTerra, (collectively, the "Satellite Parties") met with Mindel De La Torre, Roderick Porter, Robert Nelson and Gardner Foster, all of the International Bureau.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss areas where satellite systems and services might be addressed in the proceedings anticipated to follow the National Broadband Plan, and address specific issues relating thereto. The views expressed reiterated comments that SIA and its members have previously provided into the Commission's record in GN Docket No. 09-51.

The participants also discussed the Satellite Parties' continued opposition to the WSI request, as expressed in the comments filed by SIA, SkyTerra and TerreStar in Docket 07-121 and to the inclusion of the WSI or similar proposal in any subsequent Notice of Proposed Rulemaking concerning spectrum issues as discussed in the National Broadband Plan. The Satellite Parties explained that they remain concerned by (1) the lack of clarity in the WSI filings; (2) the potential for harmful interference to satellite services in frequency bands shared with terrestrial fixed services; and (3) the increased coordination difficulties that would result from WSI's proposal. The satellite industry uses these shared frequencies to provide or support many important services, including critical public safety and government services, and the distribution of broadcast and cable television to millions of Americans.
