Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 6, 2010, the undersigned spoke with Nicholas Alexander of the Wireline Competition Bureau. I stated that the state conditions adopted already essentially protect the quality of the Operations Support Systems, and require Frontier to report data that Verizon had been reporting in those states. Moreover, I stated that the maintenance fee that Frontier will pay Verizon with respect to the OSS systems is not a transition services fee, and thus does not raise the same issues as occurred in the Fairpoint OSS transition. We also discussed the status of the FCC's project to develop a broadband speed test, in which Ken Mason of Frontier also participated.

A copy of this letter is being filed in the above-referenced docket.
