Cassadaga Telephone Corporation (CTC) hereby provides notice that it intends to cease offering wireline broadband Internet access service on a tariffed basis. Effective July 1, 2010 CTC will begin offering wireline broadband Internet access service on a Title II, common carriage, permissive detariffed basis pursuant to paragraph 94 of the Federal Communications Commission's Wireline Broadband Order.<sup>1</sup> The geographic areas affected are those CTC exchanges where DSL is technically feasible.

Today, the only customer of this service is CTC's nonregulated affiliate Internet Service Provider ("ISP"). The affiliate purchases wireline broadband access service for use as a component in its broadband Internet service sold to residential and business consumers. End user service provided by the affiliate will not be affected by discontinuance of the tariffed offering by CTC. As stated in the attached customer notice, CTC will continue to offer services to existing ISP customer(s) under current rates, terms and conditions until the end of their current term or upon replacement with a Broadband Commercial Agreement. Broadband Commercial Agreements will be made available in a nondiscriminatory manner to any provider desiring to purchase wireline broadband access service for use as a component in its broadband Internet service sold to consumers.

Effective July 1, 2010, CTC will make its wireline broadband Internet access service on a permissive detariffed, common carriage basis through posting of rates, terms and conditions at [www.dftcommunications.com](http://www.dftcommunications.com). Printed copies will also be available during normal business hours at CTC's business office located at 40 Temple St., Fredonia, New York 14063.

Dear Valued Customer:

Our records indicate that Netsync Internet Services Corp. is currently purchasing wholesale broadband transport services from Cassadaga Telephone Corporation (“CTC”) via NECA tariff No. 5 (“Tariff”). This letter is to advise you that CTC’s study area 150076 will discontinue provisioning service on July 1, 2010 pursuant to the Tariff. Services will be made available to you on a common carrier, non-tariffed basis. The existing relevant rates, terms and conditions will not change until the end of your term or until replaced by a Broadband Commercial Agreement.

The actions described above are taken in accordance with the FCC’s Report and Order (FCC 05-150) released September 23, 2005 in Docket No. 02-33. In this order the FCC determined that facilities-based wireline broadband internet service providers could offer their services on a common carrier, permissively detariffed basis.
