Dear Chairman Genachowski,

I write to provide 23 additional signatures from Members of Congress, expressing support for my May 7<sup>th</sup> request that the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) hold public hearings on the Comcast-NBC merger. My colleagues and I believe it is imperative that the American public be given ample opportunity to have an open dialogue with the Commission about how this merger will affect local communities – particularly minority and low-income communities.

In addition to the hearings, the Commission must require Comcast and NBC Universal to publicly answer critical questions. These questions include a detailed analysis of the companies' employment of women and minorities in executive leadership, management positions, and contracting opportunities. The Commission must fully assess what Comcast and NBC have done to foster creative freedom and diversity in media programming, distribution, and ownership.

I have attached the original letter sent to you on May 7, 2010 (signed by 45 Members of Congress) along with a list of additional signatures to the letter and request. I do sincerely hope you will continue to fulfill your commitment to the public trust and ensure that the FCC gives the Comcast-NBC merger an exhaustive and thorough review – beginning with preparing a plan for multiple hearings that provide sufficient time for the public to participate.
