**ENFORCEMENT BUREAU'S SUPPLEMENTAL RESPONSES TO
APPLICANT'S FIRST INTERROGATORIES**

1. The Enforcement Bureau ("Bureau"), pursuant to the Order, FCC M-02 (ALJ Sippel, rel. April 15, 2010)("Order"), hereby supplements its prior responses to certain interrogatories propounded by William F. Crowell ("Crowell") in Applicant's First Set of Interrogatories To F.C.C. Enforcement Bureau, filed February 26, 2008.

2. The Bureau further responds to the following interrogatories:

INTERROGATORY NO. 76: Does the Bureau claim that it has actual intercepts of transmissions by Applicant which it intends to introduce into evidence at the hearing herein?

a. As to any such intercepts, state the date, time, frequency, stations involved in the QSO, the technical method of signal identification (e.g., "signal signature" or "mobile automatic direction finding") and provide a transcript of the alleged "intentional interference".

Response: The Bureau renews its objections to this Interrogatory¹ on the basis that it requires the Bureau to prematurely present information about its direct case. As discovery in this proceeding is still underway, the Bureau has not yet developed a comprehensive exhibit list and is, therefore unable to presently identify those materials it intends to move into evidence at the hearing in this case. In addition, the Interrogatory seeks documents in the form of transcripts and, as such, constitutes a prohibited request upon the Bureau to produce documents.

Subject to and without waiving the foregoing objections, the Bureau attaches, as Attachment A, a chart containing responsive information received and properly cataloged by the Bureau regarding recordings of radio transmissions allegedly made by Mr. Crowell. Because discovery has been

on hold in this case, the Bureau has not completed its investigation into the accuracy or source of the recordings.

c. State by whom all such intercepts were made, and whether the person making each was a Commission employee, an Official Observer, or neither. As to each person making any such intercepts, state the person's full name, call sign (if any), business and residence addresses and telephone numbers and occupation, as well as the date, time and frequency on which such intercepts were made.

Response: The Bureau renews its objections to this Interrogatory,² namely that it requires the Bureau to prematurely present information about its direct case. Furthermore, as discovery in this proceeding is still underway, the Bureau has not yet developed a comprehensive exhibit list and is, therefore, unable to presently identify those materials it intends to offer into evidence.

Subject to and without waiving the foregoing objections, the Bureau responds that the attachment hereto provides responsive and properly cataloged information provided to the Bureau regarding the source of the recordings and the date, time and frequency on which the recordings were made.

INTERROGATORY NO. 113: Which, if any, of the complaints and/or recordings filed against Applicant did the Bureau find to be invalid or fake?

Response: The Bureau renews its objection to this Interrogatory³ on the ground that it seeks information that is neither relevant to the matters here in issue nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Subject to and without waiving the foregoing objection the Bureau reiterates its prior response that, although it has not completed its investigation, it has not currently found any complaint or recording filed against Applicant to be invalid or fake.


