Dear Messrs. Glover and Nakahata:

By letters dated April 22/23, 2010, you have requested expanded protection under the Second Protective Order, dated February 2, 2010, ("Second PO"),<sup>1</sup> which was supplemented by letter on March 12, 2010<sup>2</sup>, for certain information that you are submitting in your responses to the Commission's Supplemental Information Request, dated April 20, 2010. Specifically, the information for which you are requesting Highly Confidential Information status is for the additional information you are now submitting that falls within the eligible categories discussed in the Second PO and March 12 Letter as follows:

To the extent that the information or documents (or portions thereof) submitted to the Commission in response to the specific sections of the Supplemental Information Request set forth above fall within the categories of information listed above and contain Highly Confidential Information, as defined in the Second PO,<sup>3</sup> then such information may be designated and submitted as "Highly Confidential" under the Second PO.
