Yesterday, Paula Kerger, President and Chief Executive Officer of the Public Broadcasting Service (“PBS”), Michael D. Jones, Chief Operating Officer of PBS, and the undersigned, counsel to PBS, met with Commissioner Robert M. McDowell and his Legal Advisor, Rosemary C. Harold.

In the meeting, Ms. Kerger discussed the activities of PBS and its member stations in areas which underscore the promise of public media in the evolving media landscape, such as children’s educational content and news and public affairs. Ms. Kerger also discussed the transition of PBS and its member stations to a multi-platform public media ecosystem that combines the universality of the digital broadcast platform with the interactivity and versatility of broadband-enabled platforms.

Ms. Kerger observed that the most significant issues being taken up by the Commission — such as the role of technology and media in the education and wellbeing of the nation’s children, access to and adoption of broadband, and the future of media itself — are of great interest and importance to PBS, its member stations, and the communities they serve. The PBS representatives then discussed PBS’s filings in the above-referenced filings, including with respect to uses of broadcast spectrum, the role of public media in the future of media, and children’s media.
