On June 2, 2010, Cristina Pauzé and Steven Teplitz, both of Time Warner Cable, and the undersigned met with the following Commission personnel to discuss the petition for rulemaking pending in the above-captioned docket: Austin Schlick, Marilyn Sonn, and Susan Aaron of the Office of General Counsel, together with William Lake, Mary Beth Murphy, Nancy Murphy, Diana Sokolow, and Chris Hickman of the Media Bureau. Separately, we met with Joshua Cinelli, Media Advisor to Commissioner Copps, and summer clerks Michael Park and Jay All, regarding these same issues. During these meetings, we discussed the Commission's authority under Sections 325 and 309 of the Communications Act to address the mounting consumer harms caused by the problems afflicting the retransmission consent process. We also reiterated Time Warner Cable's support for promptly initiating a rulemaking proceeding to adopt reforms that would protect consumers from the constant threat of service disruptions and cost increases.
