Dear Chairman Genachowski:

The Kiwanis Club of Little Havana, a non-profit organization established in the State of Florida since 1975, supports the joint venture between NBC Universal and Comcast.

For more than three decades, Telemundo-51 and NBC-6 have collaborated with the Kiwanis Club of Little Havana as a sponsor of Carnaval Miami and Calle Ocho; events recognized worldwide as the largest Hispanic celebration in the U.S.A. Calle Ocho spans 23 blocks long in Little Havana's main artery and is known to attract ONE million people during its 8-hour duration. Telemundo-51 and NBC-6 sponsor and produce a major musical stage where thousands of people gather to enjoy the diverse cultural heritage typical of South Florida's community.

Carnaval Miami and its main event, Calle Ocho, are far more than the largest street party in the nation; thanks to the support of corporate sponsors, these events allow the Kiwanis Club of Little Havana to conduct projects and programs of great impact to the underserved youth of South Florida. Over the last 35 years, members of the Kiwanis Club of Little Havana have trained over 6,000 children in the club's basketball league; provided a full summer of activities to more than 3,000 children at the annual summer camp; distributed school supplies to about 80,000 children attending schools in disadvantaged neighborhoods; our scholarship program has graduated 250 scholars currently with 55 students in full four-year scholarships.

During the holiday season, the distribution of toys and bicycles have touched the lives of more than 100,000 children and the "adoption" of families fulfilled the needs and wishes of thousands. The Club has built playgrounds at city parks and initiated after-school tutoring along with family literacy programs. It organizes holiday meals for the elderly

and the homeless, contributes to the medical needs of children and donates to other charitable causes. Our Club is often the “last resource” for people with desperate needs.

The Kiwanis Club of Little Havana programs have been broadcast through Telemundo-51 and NBC-6 informing the community and alerting other organizations.

It is the impression of the Kiwanis Club of Little Havana that the merger of NBC Universal and Comcast would make our corporate support stronger and thus benefit the community at large.
